As I reflect on this milestone, I appreciate all of the people who contributed to our rich history and accomplishments. I am also inspired by how vibrant the Center has remained. Our reach and our impact are as great as they have ever been. The opportunity to shape the future is as important and compelling as ever.

Your 2023 accomplishments

- Offered military members and veterans practical insights into farm operation, financing, and management. During this three-year project, 72 veterans shadowed experienced farmers, gained agriculture experience, and developed support networks.
- Championed rural small businesses nationwide by writing the Rural Microentrepreneur Assistance Act of 2023 and gathering bipartisan congressional support to get it introduced as a marker bill.
- Empowered nearly 2,000 participants through small business trainings and one-on-one sessions. Each entrepreneur provides a boost to Main Streets across Nebraska.
- Connected 33 Spanish-speaking entrepreneurs in Fremont and Schuyler, Nebraska, with experienced business professionals through Mesa de expertos y recorrido de negocios (Table of Experts and Business Tour).
- Supported organic producers by calling for improved crop insurance rules in the farm bill, including planting dates that better align with organic best practices.

- Created solar siting guides for lowa and Nebraska to help local lawmakers write solar project regulations in addition to producing environmentally friendly electricity. Rural solar offers income diversity for farmers.
- Many of you joined us in calling, emailing, and meeting virtually with policymakers at nearly all levels of government, from rural electric boards to the halls of Congress.
- Hosted 36 industry-specific academies focusing on how to run a business in rural America's most in-demand fields, such as child care, construction, and restaurants.
- Bolstered local food systems with a \$15 million lending initiative to support the growth of small meat and poultry processors and independent livestock farmers.
- Showcased the strength and resilience of rural communities to the USDA's undersecretary for rural development and Nebraska state officials during a tour of small businesses that have benefited from Center technical assistance and loans.

- Strengthened rural communities through entrepreneurship and homeownership by placing more than \$31.7 million in loans since beginning lending in 1990.
- Celebrated 50 years since rural champions founded the Center for Rural Affairs on Sept. 5, 1973. With your support, we will continue to help build a vibrant future for all rural Americans.
- Brought in 147 attendees to 19 local food and makerspace workshops, alongside the Isanti and UMÓⁿHOⁿ people. Session leaders focused on culture and traditions, improving food access, and business development.
- Assisted 17 families in buying or fixing their homes, thanks to \$1,284,835 in housing loans.
- Held the Organic Transition Academy, which helped 61 grain, livestock, and fruit and vegetable farmers explore the transition and economics of certified organic production.

Legislative Change that Matters

Entrepreneurs and communities told us about overregulation hampering food truck businesses in Nebraska. We listened, and with your support, partnered with lawmakers to turn your solution into law. Seth Coates of Scouty's Shaved Ice, pictured, and many more testified for the bill.
